

## Baseline Data

### Rwanda

District of Kicukiro

Sectors of Gahanga, Kanombe, Kigrama and Masaka

126 water points

597 households

31 public institutions

## Improved System

**87%** of water systems assessed were improved systems

**91%** of households collected water from an improved system

**93%** of the public institutions had improved water systems

**1** school had a water point that was part of a Water For People project

## Usage

**63** each improved system was being used by an average of 63 people

of the 8.9% that did not collect water from an improved system, 35% reported that there was an improved system available but they did not use it **35%**

**545** students, staff, patients, teachers using each improved water point

## Quality

**0** **88%** water quality testing was conducted at 18 of the improved water points and 88% had 0 fecal coliform present

**70%** reported that they treat their drinking water at home predominately by boiling or with chlorine

**3/0** water quality testing was conducted in 3 schools and all of them had 0 fecal coliforms

## Quantity

provided enough water for the community every day of the year **41%**

**64%** reported that the improved systems did not provide enough water every day of the year

did not provide enough water every day **41%**

## Distance

**100 meters** the most commonly reported distance households reported walking to collect water

## Financial

**75%** reported that a tariff or user fee was collected

reported that financial records were kept **11%**

**87%** reported that they pay a tariff for water

## Functionality

**50%** of the water points had been down for more than 1 day in the last month

**55%** of the communities reported that they had no spare parts on hand for the water system

reported that the improved water system was down for more than 1 day in the past month **14%**

## Sanitation

**63%** improved sanitation facilities

22% had water nearby for hand washing  
18% had soap available **22%/18%**

**87%** had improved sanitation facilities **33%** had problems

had water available for handwashing near latrines **63%** **37%** had soap available

**3** schools had sanitation projects supported by Water For People project
